## Remains of Amazaki Castle

Add: Amazaki, Kamiura

This is one of the oldest remains of a pirate castle in Japan. The 16<sup>th</sup> century was its golden age, and the Murakami Suigun(Pirates) lived here during the Sengoku Era. Later, it was repaired by Todo Takatora, the Lord of Imabari Castle in the early Edo Era. A part of the fixed stone wall remains.

You can walk here only when the tide is the lowest. You can feel the history of those days
